<p>The <b>Conservation Reserve Program (CRP)</b> is a habitat and land conservation program. <p>The <b>Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program (CREP)</b> is an enhanced version of CRP. Working with FSA and IDNR, landowners transform frequently flooded and environmentally sensitive cropland into conservation easements. <p><b>The Wetlands Initiative (TWI)</b> designs, restores, and creates wetlands. Through the <b>Smart Wetlands program</b>, TWI works with farmers and cropland owners to construct tile-treatment wetlands. <p>The IDNR created the <b>Illinois Recreational Access Program (IRAP)</b>, a public access program that leases private land for outdoor recreational activities. IRAP leases private land from landowners to provide access for youth and adult hunting and fishing. Eligibility & Enrollment

Application period ongoing with limited annual funding. Ranking and approval usually occurs in spring. Visit local SWCD website or call Kankakee County SWCD office at (815) 937-8940 x 3 to learn more.

Sign-up period opens in December and is first come, first served via an online application. Must certify cover crop acres via FSA Form 578.

This flexible program allows farmers to enroll acres where practices have previously been used. Applications are accepted on a rolling basis - first come, first served. **Carbon assets generated from participation in this program are being claimed by ADM.**

### Eligibility & Enrollment

Complete W9. Must enter County, Acres, 2023 and 2024 crop. For PCM farmers, years field has been covercropped, tillage used is required. ~10% of fields will be verified. Cannot combine with other ecosystem markets for that season.

An annual program open to select counties in Illinois. Contact Kevin Schabacker for assistance with enrollment or visit the SWOF website.

Project funding will be available from 2023-2027. Funding will be delivered through NRCS. Information will become available in 2023, so check with the Kankakee County SWCD to stay up-to-date.

Applications are accepted year-round. Complete an application at your local NRCS office. Special consideration given to black farmers in Pembroke Township.

### Eligibility & Enrollment

Applications are accepted year-round. Complete an application at your local NRCS office. Special consideration given to veterans, beginning farmers, socially disadvantaged farmers, and those transitioning to organic.

Continuous CRP sign up is ongoing. Dates for other CRP signups, such as General, Grassland, and CLEAR30 are forthcoming.

Producers interested in enrolling in CRP should contact the FSA office at their local USDA Service Center.

Any landowner who owns approximately 40 acres of qualifying is eligible. Interested landowners must complete an enrollment form and send it to IRAP. An IRAP coordinator will contact the landowner about their property, answer questions and complete a site visit to verify eligibility. Applications are accepted year-round.
